

OVERALL OBSERVATIONS

- Projections vs. Prints: When will we know how bad the U.S. recession will be?
 - Keep eye on Fed regional surveys & unemp claims; ADP/BLS reflects early in month.
 - Definitive prints will come in late April/early May.
- New Debate Over Epidemic Parameters: R₀, IFR, and Susceptible Population %
 - "Oxford" researchers hypothesize higher R₀, lower IFR, and higher infected share.
 - "Imperial College" defend their model; true IFR still seems $\approx 0.5\%$
- Rise of "second waves" and xenophobia
 - Second waves in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, South Korea, Japan
 - Signaling longer duration and harsher social mood.
- Vitamin D receives new support, from former CDC chief Dr. Tom Frieden
- What is "antibody-dependent enhancement" (ADE)? And why does it matter?

Antibody-Dependent Enhancement (ADE)




- Antibodies from the first infection are cross-reactive with other DENV serotypes
- · But Abs are subneutralizing
- FcyR recognizes Abs and internalizes immunocomplex
- Evidences suggest that the mechanism is associated with both increase in the number of infected cells, a phenomenon called "Extrinsic ADE," and a subversion of the intracellular innate immune host responses through suppression of a the type I IFN and proinflammatory cytokines production—an event denominated as "Intrinsic ADE"


Initial Unemployment Claims

(in thousands), SA, 1967-Mar 28, 2020, weekly




















COVID-19 Cases and Deaths in Iran Updated April 2, 2020




COVID-19 Cases and Deaths in Spain Updated April 2, 2020










COVID-19 Cases and Deaths in USA Updated April 2, 2020








Total COVID-19 Cases Confirmed in Each State, Updated April 2, 2020



NATIONAL TESTS, TOTAL AND TESTS PER MILLION


Total Tests and Total Tests Per Million People for COVID-19, February 1 - March 31, 2020









COVID-19 Cases and Deaths in China Updated April 2, 2020







Passenger Traffic and Cumulative Net Inflow of People In 10 Chinese Cities Updated April 1, 2020







Daily Cinema Ticket sales and Daily Property Sales In 30 Chinese Cities Updated April 2, 2020






Coal Consumption at Power Plants and Intensity of Night Lights At 143 Industrial Parks, Updated April 2, 2020





Store Floor Space, Coal Consumption, Container Freights, Traffic, Pollution, and Box Office Sales in China Updated April 1, 2020




WILL THE REAL DEATH TOLL PLEASE STAND UP?


AS EXPECTED, YoY CHANGE IN TOTAL DEATH GREATLY EXCEEDS C19-POSITIVE DEATHS

Most egregious in China, due to lack of test kids (in February) and deliberately restrictive counting of both tests and cases.


But undercounting continues in France and Italy—in part due to counting only deaths in hospitals.

Excess in total YoY deaths is a count more comparable to the way CDC calculates flu death. And it roughly may double the death toll.







Projection of All Hospital Beds Needed For COVID-19




Projection of ICU Beds Needed For COVID-19



Projection of Invasive Ventilators Needed For COVID-19





Projection of Daily COVID-19 Deaths

US, UK, Philadelphia, and St. Louis Deaths From The Spanish Flu Per 1,000 Persons, 1918-1919









Spanish Flu Mortality US, Europe, and US Cities, 1918-1919
